A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Friends,

As you are making your lists and checking them twice, I want to offer you a special gift ... especially for the list enthusiasts among us... a Very BPC Christmas List... a few ways for you to celebrate without exhausting your soul.

- Ask yourself, "What is my yes this Advent?" Choose one service opportunity that connects you to those who are struggling. One Bible Study or class that will connect you more deeply to the church community. One gift you can give to ease the suffering of the world. Let your yes be sincere, and you will feel the Holy Spirit there.
- Ask yourself, "What is the no, or refusal, you have been postponing?" What is one thing you can really say no to this year in order to make space for Christ?
- Show up for a youth. In this time of transition when we are missing Pastor Adam Ogg and our new leader has not arrived yet, send a card of encouragement to one of our youth or support them at a game or a concert at school.



- Show up for a senior. There are people in our congregation and in your neighborhood, I imagine, who spend a lot of time alone. Give them a phone call or linger and have a conversation.
- I heard someone say, "It's not Christmas that has been overrun... those days after Christmas are still calm, holy, prayerful times. It's Advent that has been overrun!" Let your Sundays of Advent involve worship, lighting the Advent candles, meals together, and prayerful quiet.
- Invite people to worship with you in Advent and on Christmas Eve. Most people are longing for hope, peace, joy and love in their lives, and most people only find a church home because someone told them about it and welcomed them personally. No website could ever beat a personal welcome.

These require no wrapping, but will wrap you in the peace of Christ. I hope your spirit is renewed as you worship, connect and serve with us this year!

Special Mission Projects During Advent

Here at Burke Presbyterian Church, we have many opportunities to help our neighbors, especially during the season of Advent.

Put together a Bethany Stocking

Bring to church on December 3

For many years at Christmastime, BPC members have made stockings filled with essentials for the women who visit the Bethany Center on N Street in downtown DC. Bethany Center helps women facing homelessness and women and children escaping domestic violence. Here's how to put together a stocking:

- Buy thick knee socks (men's socks work very well).
- Stuff the second sock into the toe of the first.
- Fill the rest of the sock with items that would be useful to a woman without a stable home, such as toothpaste, toothbrush, hat, gloves, a scarf, other small toiletries, a notebook, pens, pencils ... use your imagination to make it fun!
- Tie off the end of the stocking with a ribbon and bring it to church on December 3.



Drop off a sweater for the men of Christ House

Bring to church on December 3

BPC has a long tradition of supplying sweaters for the men who reside at Christ House (short term) and Kairos House (long term), facilities in downtown DC for the formerly homeless, so that each man receives a sweater at the annual Christ House holiday event. Shop for our adopted Homestretch family

Bring to church by December 10

In 2018, BPC began a partnership with Homestretch, an organization that empowers homeless families to secure permanent housing and to attain the skills, knowledge, and hope they need to achieve self-sufficiency. Through the Homestretch Sacred Homes program, BPC is helping to

support "C" and her two children. Our support includes helping to bring a wonderful Christmas to C and her family by buying items from their wish list. Because of the need for confidentiality, we refer to the mother, who is head of household, by "C," her first initial. She has a son in elementary school and a daughter in college. BPC receives quarterly reports about C from Homestretch, and some members of the Mission ministry team have occasional direct contact with the family. C is working hard with resources from Homestretch to gain self-sufficiency so she can "graduate" from their program. We have been so inspired as C works to earn her GED and works toward US citizenship, along with her full-time job. BPC's quarterly contribution to Homestretch helps support C's housing costs. BPC also contributes to a Thanksgiving gift card for the family.

Provide a Christmas meal for an ECHO family

Contact ECHO no later than Monday, December 11

Through ECHO's holiday meal program, you can deliver groceries or mail a gift card that will help a local family with a Christmas meal. Last month for Thanksgiving, ECHO received requests from 225 families, and many of you stepped forward to sponsor a family. We now have another opportunity, to help families with a festive meal for Christmas. Please see below for details. If you can participate, start by sending an email to holidayfoodprograms@echoinc.org **no later than Monday, December 11** to express your interest.

The program works like this for donors who wish to deliver their food in person:

- **No later than December 11,** send an e-mail to holidayfoodprograms@echo-inc.org asking for a family to assist.
- Receive contact information about a family: ages of children, cultural background, etc.
- Get a list of suggested foods to include, if desired.
- Contact the family to arrange delivery date/time.
- Shop for appropriate groceries.
- Deliver the food at least one week before the holiday, before December 18.

The program works like this for donors who wish to purchase a gift card:

- **No later than December 11,** send an e-mail to holidayfoodprograms@echo-inc.org to get contact information and size of the client family.
- Find out the closest food store to the client's address (transportation is sometimes a problem for needy families).
- Purchase food store gift cards in an appropriate amount for the family size (ECHO suggests at least \$65 for a family of four plus \$10 for each additional member, not including infants)
- Mail the gift card to the family to arrive at least 10 days before the holiday (December 15, 2023), giving them time to shop and prepare the meal.
- Consider enclosing the gift card in a festive holiday card and use ECHO's return address (7205 Old Keene Mill Rd, Springfield, VA 22150).

Thank you for your generous gifts to ECHO's food pantry! Your faithful, weekly donations of food and hygiene items help keep the shelves stocked during this time of continuing need. Remember to add to your shopping list some of ECHO's "most needed" items, such as protein (canned chicken, Spam, sardines, chili, beef stew) and canned fruit. Wondering about the coffee/chocolate sales in the Gathering Space?

We sell Equal Exchange coffee, tea, and chocolate. This is not for profit; we sell at cost* to support farmers in South and Central America and other parts of the world. Our pre-Covid numbers were about \$2,000 worth of coffee/chocolate per year. When we got started again, we ordered and sold \$1,500 of materials in 2022. So far in 2023, our orders total \$1,700.

*We sell at rounded numbers (\$3 instead of \$2.87); any extra income goes to our Mission Ministry.

Interested in traveling to Kibwezi, Kenya, with a group of 18-20 adults, college students, and older youth? We're planning a trip in July 2024, for two to three weeks, with lodging at Kambua Guest House. The goal of the trip is to strengthen our partnership with Bethel Church, to work on projects in/around Kibwezi, and to learn, give, and receive in the context of Christian fellowship.

The cost will be approximately \$2500 per person; \$250 will be due by January 31, 2024, and the

Key areas of focus for the BPC Social Witness group have been affordable housing and housing insecurity, racial justice, criminal justice, climate justice, immigration, and civic engagement. We are guided by the statement that our General Assembly "affirms its conviction that neither the Church as the body of Christ, nor Christians as individuals, can be neutral or indifferent toward evil in the world; affirms its responsibility to speak on social and moral issues for the encouragement and instruction of the Church and its members...corporately to reveal God's grace in places of suffering and need...for only so is the gospel most fully proclaimed..." (1958 Statement – PC(USA), p. 537).

PERSONNEL UPDATE

Although he is not a chocolate, the departure of Pastor Adam Ogg is undoubtedly bittersweet. While we are sad to see him go, we are proud of and excited for him as he begins the next chapter of his life in the Pacific Northwest. We had a heartfelt celebration on his last day to send him off with love and community.

Much is happening in the Personnel Committee after Adam's departure. Under Pastor Becca's leadership, the committee has already made important strides in moving toward the future. The search for an Interim Director of Youth Ministries is already underway. The job posting is on the website, our social media pages, Indeed.com, the National Presbytery, and it is being distributed throughout personal networks in the church. If you would like a copy of the job posting to share with potential applicants, feel free to contact the Elder for Personnel, Seth Parsons.

The search committee for this interim position is the Personnel Committee along with a youth representative and a parent representative. We will keep the congregation posted as we continue with the search.

Meanwhile, progress on the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) for the permanent position is also underway. Pastor Becca, Elder for Nominations Michael Hrabak, and Dan Herrema are working to begin the process of creating an APNC. An important note is that the National Presbytery is striving to speed up the timeline for the hiring process. Rather than the one to two years that was previously typical, the goal is now six to nine months.

Another Personnel transition is that Elizabeth Reece is stepping back from her Director of Communications position. She is reducing work time to increase time with her family, a transition that will take place at the end of the year. Elizabeth has been an integral member of the office staff and she will be missed in that role, though we look forward to continuing to see her at church!
